

## **PRESCRIPTION AND CO-PAY ASSISTANCE**

Prescription Assistance programs mainly provide prescription assistance services to people without insurance. When a person loses their job they will most likely lose prescription drug coverage, unless coverage is continued under COBRA or their employer has agreed to extend them for a certain amount of time.
